

Chorus Music Camp Information and Policies



- **Sign-in and Sign-out:** For safety reasons, parents/guardians must sign-in and sign-out campers each day of camp. Campers will only be allowed to leave with the persons pre-authorized to pick them up.
- **Lunch and Snacks:** If you provide a lunch for your child, please ensure it does not require refrigeration or heating. All lunches and snacks must be **NUT FREE**. Please pack extra snacks for morning and afternoon breaks. Pizza lunch is provided on Tuesdays and Fridays for full day campers.
- **Water:** All campers are required to bring a bottle of water labelled with their name.
- **Accidents & Emergencies:** If your child is injured, you will be notified immediately. Staff will complete an incident report and our CPR trained staff will assist your child. Camp staff will make necessary decisions concerning further medical care. During registration, you must sign a waiver form allowing the Camp Supervisors or designated appointee to authorize all procedures, including admission to the hospital and necessary treatment, in the event of an emergency.
- **Illness:** If your child becomes ill while at camp, you will be notified immediately. Our CPR trained staff will help your child in any way they can. You may need to pick up your child from camp. However, missed camp days will be refunded with a doctor's note.
- **Medication:** Please fill out the medical information section during registration if your child requires any prescription medications. Asthma Inhalers and Epi-Pens must be carried by your child at all times. Medication must be provided to reception at morning sign in. Prescription medications must be in the original pharmacy bottle, labeled with the name of the patient and the physician who ordered the dose. Nonprescription and over-the-counter medication will not be permitted. Please contact the camp coordinator if you wish to discuss your child's medications or medical conditions in advance.
- **Valuables:** Chorus Music is not responsible for any lost or stolen articles. Leave all valuables at home and label all personal items. All unclaimed items left from the camp will be donated after a few months.

Code of conduct:

At Chorus, our goal is to provide a fun, safe, secure, and respectful environment for all campers and staff. Chorus Music Academy reserve the right to ask a parent to pick up their child early, temporarily suspend or, in extreme cases, expel the camper without any refund.

We expect all campers to abide by to the following rules:

- Follow the directions of the camp staff and actively participate in all camp activities.
- Stay with your designated group at all times.
- Be respectful, honest and considerate of other campers, staff, volunteers and guests.
- Be respectful of Chorus Music property and property of other campers, staff or guests.
- Clothing should not be overly revealing, for example skimpy, back-less, showing undergarments, transparent etc. Shorts and skirts are fine to wear as long as they are not obscenely short.
- Symbols that communicate the message of drugs, violence, sexism, hatred, homophobia, or identify campers as members of gangs/anti-social groups cannot be worn.

Chorus Music Academy has a zero tolerance policy & will immediately suspend a camper with no refund in case of:

1. Stealing or damaging property of Chorus Music or others, including staff, fellow campers, and guests.
2. Bullying or abusive behavior, whether physical, verbal or cyber, toward staff, fellow campers, and guests.
3. Use of alcohol or drugs.
4. Using profanity, obscenity or vulgarity or acting in a vulgar way.
